July 8 – 14, 2007

Sunday, July 8

Multiple Medical Calls at Hurricane Hills, Route 106 – Greenfield Township

Three times during the day, Greenfield Ambulance was requested to standby at Hurricane Hills while Cottage Hose transported a dirt bike racer to an area hospital.

Tuesday, July 10

Truck Fire, I-81 Rest Area at 202 mm – Greenfield Township

At 6:30 PM Greenfield Fire and EMS units were dispatched to a possible tractor/ trailer on fire in the north-bound rest area at mile marker 202, I-81. While en-route, the County 911 Center received further calls indicating the trailer was carrying a load of rolled paper and was fully involved. Chief 24 requested a 2nd alarm be dispatched for water and to aide in refreshing firefighters in the 80-degree heat. Greenfield was assisted by an Engine and Tanker from Scott Township, an Ambulance and Tanker from Clifford Township and a Tanker from Fleetville. While the fire was declared under control within minutes, overhaul and removal of the damaged trailer caused Greenfield crews quickly controlled the main body of the fire, but remained on scene until 10:30 PM assisting in the clean up of the rest area.



Thursday, July 12

Accident, RT 106 - Greenfield Township

Just after 10:20 AM, Greenfield Engine and Ambulance were dispatched to a truck versus car accident at Finch Hill Corners. The truck driver refused treatment or transport. A female was transported from the scene by Clifford Ambulance.



Friday, July 13

Vehicle Fire I81, South at Mile Marker 206 – Clifford Township

Greenfield and Clifford units were dispatched to a possible vehicle fire on I-81 at the 206 mile marker at 12:30 PM. On arrival, Clifford Fire Chief Turner advised that the vehicle over-heated. All units were released at 12:50 PM.

Medical Emergency, Wagner Blvd – Greenfield Township

Greenfield Ambulance was dispatched at 10:50 PM for an infant having difficulty breathing. Greenfield transported the infant to a Scranton hospital aided by Cottage Hose Paramedics.

Saturday, July 14

Decon Assist to Susquehanna County, Thompson

Greenfield was request at 10:50 AM to assist Thompson Hose Company at a Decontamination Training Session at their fire station. Greenfield responded their Decon truck with equipment and supplies for the class.
