Tuesday, August 14

Pump Operator Training, Newton Lake – Greenfield Township

Members of the Greenfield Township Fire Company and Clifford Fire Company traveled to Newton Lake for additional pump training exercise. Personnel reviewed drafting from a water source and correct pressure and relief valve settings for flowing multiple lines. Three lengths of 6-inch hard suction with a strainer on the end were dropped into Newton Lake. A flotation device (to stop the water from swirling) was attached to the strainer. Three "hose lines" were then set up. Not having enough personnel to man the three "lines," they made due with what they had. The first line was the "deck gun" or master stream. The second and third lines were compiled by attaching nozzles to the number 1 and 2 side discharges. With all three "lines" flowing, it made for some serious water flow.

Greenfield personnel investigated the alarm with Scott Fire Chief and it was determined to be caused by a faulty detector.
