Sunday, October 14, 2007

Medical Emergency, I-81 N Mile Marker 202 – Greenfield Township

Greenfield Ambulance and Community Life Support Paramedics were dispatched for a medical emergency in the Northbound Rest Area on I-81 at mile marker 203 in Greenfield Township approximately at noon. An area person was transported to the hospital.

Structure Fire, SR 2067 – Clifford Township

Greenfield Engine, Tanker and Ambulance were dispatched to assist Clifford Fire and Ambulance for a structure fire on SR 2067 near Lake Idlewild in Clifford Township at approximately 8 PM. Greenfield Engine responded to the scene and the crew advanced a backup line into the structure. Greenfield Tanker stood by at scene but was not needed as a permanent water source was established. Greenfield Ambulance stood by at our station.

Medical Emergency, Spedding Road – Greenfield Township

Greenfield Ambulance and Cottage Paramedics were dispatched for a medical emergency on Spedding Road in Greenfield Township approximately at noon. A resident was transported to the Hospital.

Tuesday, October 16, 2007

Controlled Burn, Justina Drive – Carbondale Township

Greenfield Command car was dispatched for a report of heavy black smoke in the area of Petrilak Road in Greenfield Township at approximately 6 PM. The incident was found to be a controlled burn on Justina Drive in Carbondale Township.

Work Session for Installation of New Air Compressor

Greenfield members spent their regular Tuesday night work session preparing for the installation of the new Breathing Air Compressor that Greenfield received as a part of the Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program through the Federal Emergency Management Program. The new unit cost approximately \$30,000, but most of that was covered through the grant.

The new Compressor, which was manufactured by Scott Technologies and sold to Greenfield by Midlantic Fire & Air is a major improvement from the 20 year old unit which it replaced. The new unit enables Greenfield to fill the cascade system twice as fast as previously, but is also significantly quieter, and features many safety shutdowns that the previous unit did not have.



Wednesday, October 17, 2007

Motor Vehicle Accident, Route 374 – Clifford Township

Greenfield Engine was dispatched to assist Clifford Rescue and Ambulance for a motor vehicle accident on Route 374 in Clifford Township at approximately 5:20 PM. Greenfield Engine was cancelled while responding as the accident was a minor incident and services were not needed.
