Week In Review

September 1

MVA Assist to Clifford at MM 206 for a vehicle over the barrier in the construction zone. Greenfield Engine and EMS were requested. Greenfield Engine responded and were cancelled by Command 18 as no accident was found.

At 8:35 Greenfield crews were requested by Susquehanna County to assist Clifford at MM 210.5 NORTH for a one vehicle rollover. All Greenfield units were cancelled while in-route.

September 3

At 4:35 Greenfield units were dispatched to assist Station 61, Fell Township for a possible grease fire at the Homestead Golf Course on SR 106. Fell Township units arrived on scene and found the fire extinguished and put Greenfield Units back in service within minutes.

September 4

At 6:49 Greenfield Ambulance was dispatched to MM 203.5 to assist PSP for a patient with possible mental health issues. Greenfield Ambulance rendezvoused Lackawanna paramedics and transported a patient to a city hospital.

September 6

At 3:30 p.m. Greenfield Ambulance was dispatched to Pierce Road for a medical call. Greenfield Ambulance and Cottage paramedics transported a patient to a local hospital.

September 8

At 12:14 p.m. Greenfield Ambulance was dispatched to assist Clifford Ambulance for a medical call in Clifford. Greenfield Ambulance was cancelled while in-route.

September 9

At 8:58 a.m. Greenfield were dispatched to Pierce Road for a medical call. Greenfield QRS crew assisted Cottage Ambulance with loading the patient for transport to a local hospital.

At 4:42 p.m. Greenfield Ambulance was requested to stand-by at Hurricane Hills while Cottage Ambulance transported a patient to the local trauma center.

September 12

At 7:31 p.m. Greenfield Engine and Ambulance responded for possible wires down and a transformer smoking just off Rt. 247 near the entrance to the Finch Hill trailer Court. Greenfield units arrived to find brush around the pole smoldering but no wires on fire. Units stayed on scene until PPL arrived.
